- c) Cafeteria staff review procedures with students. Very simple. Less than 60 seconds. Kids are bright..... it's pretty simple. Place signage on the bins provided in this file
- d) Agency or cafeteria staff text Food Rescue the first pick up at each school to 317-694-4006, or email it to jw@foodrescue.net, or post it on our many social media pages found on our website. More pictures help us spread the word.
